Subject: Status Update of Groundwater Levels at Index Stations

Only one index well remains within a low groundwater status level for the production week that ended on July 9, 2011. Kaimuki remains under a caution condition. The weekly production average for the period was 139.00 million gallons per day.

The Board of Water Supply rainfall index for the month of June was 197 percent of normal with a 5-month moving average of 137 percent. Aquifer head levels are still maintaining levels that reflect the lower production rates experienced this year.
